

Volunteering Regulations at the European Athletics Team Championships

1. The Regulations define the principles of volunteering during the European Athletics Team Championships (hereinafter referred to as the "Event") which takes place between 29th and 30th May 2021 in the cities of Katowice and Chorzów and at Pyrzowice and Balice airports. The activities of Volunteers will be carried out between 17 May and 01 June 2021.

2. The organizer of the Event is the Silesian Stadium (hereinafter referred to as the Organizer), and the organizer of volunteering - Regional Volunteer Centre Association (RCW) (hereinafter referred to as the Beneficiary).

3. Volunteering is provided in accordance with the provisions set out in the Act of 24 April 2003 on public benefit activity and volunteerism (Journal of Laws of 2019, item 688 as amended). This includes, but is not limited to, the following principles:

- volunteering is done for the benefit of an eligible non-governmental organization;
- the volunteer should have appropriate qualifications and meet the requirements appropriate to the type and scope of the services performed;
- the volunteer's responsibilities are defined in a written agreement with the Beneficiary;
- at the request of the Volunteer, the Beneficiary may give a written opinion about the work performed by the Volunteer; the Volunteer will also receive a certificate confirming the tasks performed.

4. Volunteers will be provided with food and ID (accreditation). Volunteers will be trained in the topography of the facility and will receive position training. The organizer provides safe conditions for the realization of the Event.

5. Volunteers will be provided with:

- written volunteer agreement,
- personal accident insurance,
- certificate confirming participation in the volunteer program, issued on the day of the Event
- personal protective equipment (masks, gloves) in connection with participation in the event during the sanitary regime in force.

6. Volunteer duties:

- The volunteer should perform his/her duties personally;
- The volunteer should wear a t-shirt and ID badge while volunteering;
- The volunteer should arrive on time at the collection site and be present according to the schedule provided in advance;
- The volunteer should use personal protective equipment, i.e., masks and gloves, and use and replace them according to the instructions provided prior to the event;
- The volunteer must not consume alcohol and other intoxicating substances during volunteer activities

7. The volunteer is eligible to receive:

- written agreement;
 - a certificate attesting to the performance of services;
 - written opinion (under the terms of the Act);
 - personal accident insurance;
 - A meal during volunteering;
 - ID badge;
 - personal protective equipment in relation to the epidemiological situation
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- position and topography training

8. In the event that a Volunteer has received his/her volunteer kit and fails to appear at the time and place of the assignment, the Volunteer is required to return the equipment received.

9. Due to the execution of the Event under the regime caused by the COVID-19 epidemic threat, the Volunteer will be provided with personal protective equipment (i.e. masks and gloves). In a situation where the Volunteer is diagnosed with SARS-Cov2 virus infection after the Event (up to 2 weeks), the Volunteer should inform the Volunteer Coordinator. At the same time, the Volunteer shall not claim compensation from the Beneficiary due to the infection.

11. Personal Data

a) The data controller is the Regional Volunteer Centre Association in Katowice, located at ul. Warszawska 19, 40-009 Katowice, registered in the National Court Register under the number 0000290674, NIP ("Tax Identification Number") 6342662552, REGON no.: 24078063800000

b) The provision of personal data is necessary for the recruitment process and, in the case of signing a volunteer agreement, for the purpose of performing services for the Beneficiary - in accordance with Article 6 (1) (a and b) of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) of 27 April 2016.

c) The data controller informs that:

a. The provision of data is voluntary, but necessary for the conclusion of the agreement;

b. The volunteer has the right to request access to their personal data, correction, erasure - in accordance with Article 17 of the GDPR, restriction of processing, the right to data portability, the right to withdraw consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of the processing;

c. The volunteer has the right to object to processing and to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, the Office for Personal Data Protection.

d. Personal data will be kept for the period necessary to implement the cooperation agreement;

e. In case of non-admission to volunteering or failure to sign a cooperation agreement, personal data will be deleted immediately;

f. Data shall not be used for automated decisions or profiling

12. The rules for volunteering at the Event are based on the provisions contained in:

a) The Act of 24 April 2003 on public benefit activity and volunteerism

b) Volunteering Regulations

c) Volunteer Service Agreement between the Beneficiary and the Volunteer

13. A change in any provision of these Regulations may be made by a RCW representative without written notice to the volunteers.

14. The final interpretation of these Regulations rests with the Beneficiary and the Organizer.
