

MASS EVENT RULES AND REGULATIONS
“EUROPEAN ATHLETICS TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS AT THE SILESIAN STADIUM”

Pursuant to art. 6 section 3 of the act of 20 March 2009 on mass event security (Journal of Laws No. 62, item 504), hereinafter referred to as the "Act", the following Rules and Regulations for mass events are hereby introduced:

Chapter I

Scope of application

§ 1

1. The Regulations apply to the mass sport event organized by Stadion Śląski Sp. z o. o. under the name: “EUROPEAN ATHLETICS TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS AT THE SILESIAN STADIUM”.
2. The Rules and Regulations shall determine the conditions of participation and behavior of participants to a mass event, including in particular the provisions regulating:
 - a. responsibilities of event participants;
 - b. conditions of participation,
 - c. rights of mass event participants;
 - d. responsibility of event participants for behavior not in compliance with the Rules and Regulations.

Chapter II

Method of organizing a mass event

§ 2

1. The event Organizer is responsible for the security of the mass event at the place and during its duration.
2. Admission to the mass event area is free.
3. Admission to the VIP area is by invitation issued by the Organizer only.
4. The number of participants able to attend the Event is determined by the Organizer based on the current COVID-19 pandemic control regulations as of the date of the Event.

Chapter III

Responsibilities of the mass event participant

§ 3

1. The event participant is obliged:
 - a. not to disturb public order;
 - b. to comply with the provisions of these Rules and Regulations and the Rules and Regulations of the facility;
 - c. to strictly adhere to applicable sanitation rules related to the prevention of the COVID-19 pandemic;
 - d. while in the VIP zone - to carry and present each time on demand of security services or mass event information services a wristband or accreditation authorizing to enter and stay in the VIP zone;
 - e. not to endanger the safety of other persons present at the mass event;
 - f. to follow the instructions given by the announcer, security services and information services of the mass event Organizer, and in case of intervention of the Police, National Fire Brigade, or employees of other authorized services and bodies;
2. For safety reasons, participants of the mass event, at the request of the security service or information service, may be obliged to occupy another place.

Chapter IV

Conditions for participation in a mass event

§ 4

1. It is prohibited to enter a mass event to a person:
 - a. against whom a final judgment has been issued banning entry to the mass event or obliging to refrain from participation in mass events;
 - b. who refuses to submit to the activities specified in Article 20 of the Act on Security of Mass Events;
 - c. who is visibly under the influence of alcohol, narcotic and psychotropic drugs or other similarly acting agents;

- d. behaving aggressively, provocatively or in any other way posing a threat to public safety or order;
 - e. who is a minor under 13 years of age and who is not supervised by an adult.
2. During a mass event, it is specifically prohibited to:
- a. use items of clothing or an object to cover the face to prevent or impede identification;
 - b. to preach and display obscene, vulgar and racist slogans, to incite national, religious and social hatred, etc.;
 - c. throw objects;
 - d. consume alcohol other than that purchased on the event premises, to use intoxicants or psychotropic substances;
 - e. to start and fuel fires and to smoke outside designated areas;
 - f. to be in possession of explosives, pyrotechnics and substances with similar effects, etc.;
 - g. to place banners or flags in a manner that limits the visibility of other event participants or in a manner that limits the visibility of advertising materials or emergency exits;
 - h. to answer the call of nature outside restrooms and litter in the stadium area, as well as destroy the infrastructure of the facility;
 - i. to unreasonably occupy space in passageways and evacuation routes;
 - j. to use the facility equipment in a manner inconsistent with its intended use.
3. It is prohibited to bring or possess at a mass event:
- a. weapons, ammunition, and other dangerous items that can be used as weapons;
 - b. explosives, pyrotechnics and substances of similar action and all types of fire hazardous materials;
 - c. containers for liquids or food made of hard material, including glass bottles;
 - d. beverages and food, except for foods intended for children or people requiring a special diet (e.g., diabetics);
 - e. alcohol, narcotic and psychotropic drugs or other similarly acting agents;
 - f. motorcycle helmets;
 - g. materials with racist, political, xenophobic or vulgar content;
 - h. containers for spraying gas, corrosive substances or dyes;
 - i. objects that due to their shape and/or size cannot be stowed under the seat;
 - j. trumpets and mechanically or electrically driven instruments.
 - k. laser pointers;
 - l. advertising materials except those permitted with the written permission of the event Organizer;
 - m. cameras and other such devices recording sound or image, except for strictly private use and of a size or specification permitted by the Organizer;
 - n. bringing in animals, except for guide dogs.
4. It is prohibited to enter areas not intended for the public. The ban applies in particular to: the area where sport competitions are held, buildings and equipment not intended for public use, facades of the facility, fences, walls, enclosures, roofs of the stadium, lighting equipment, camera platforms, trees, poles of all kinds, as well as entry to other places, equipment and rooms to which access is limited to specialist services or representatives of the event Organizer.

Chapter V

Rights of the mass event participant

§ 5

1. A mass event participant has the right to:
- a. stay at the stadium during the event, i.e. from the moment the Organizer makes the facility available to the public until the end of the mass event;
 - b. freely participate in the event expressing their emotions, which is only limited by the need to comply with generally applicable laws and the provisions set out in these Rules and Regulations;
 - c. information about the location of medical, information, catering and sanitary facilities and amenities, as well as safety requirements specified by the Organizer or emergency services;
 - d. use facilities, including hygiene and sanitation facilities, that are provided for general use, in a manner consistent with their intended use;
 - e. use medical assistance at the event;

- f. The Organizer shall allow a stroller, a child's bicycle or a child's scooter to be brought into the mass event area through each gate available for spectators' entrance, through entrances for disabled persons in wheelchairs located there.
 - g. The stroller and other items listed above may not be brought into the stadium sectors or left on the roads and passageways.
 - h. Organizer does not operate any deposit points and does not supervise the property left in the Event's area;
2. The event participant shall also be entitled to immediately report to the Organizer information and possible claims regarding damage incurred by him/her during and at the mass event.

Chapter VI
Personal data protection

§ 7

The Controller of personal data collected in connection with the conduct of the Mass Event is the Organizer and, in particular, is responsible for the processing of personal data in the ticket sales system for possible use in cases provided for in accordance with the Act of 20 March 2009 on Security of Events (uniform text: Journal of Laws of 2017, item 1160, as amended), subject to the data collected in the CCTV system of the Facility where the Mass Event takes place - of which the Controller of Personal Data is the Facility Manager - for possible use, in cases provided for in accordance with the Act of 20 March 2009 on Security of Mass Events (uniform text: Journal of Laws of 2017, item 1160, as amended)

Chapter VII
Final provisions

§ 8

1. Entry constitutes simultaneous consent to the use of one's image in connection with the production, presentation, advertising or use of the film, video and audio recording of the mass event and/or any item presented in media coverage worldwide.
2. Persons disturbing the public order or behaving contrary to the Rules and Regulations of the mass event may be removed from the mass event's venue
3. In cases specified in the act on security of mass events, the Organizer's services shall be entitled to apprehend, in order to immediately hand over to the Police, persons posing an immediate threat to the goods entrusted to their protection and persons committing criminal acts.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of these Rules and Regulations, the Organizer's services shall refuse the entry to the mass event in cases specified in Art. 22 section 1 of the act on security of mass events.
5. The Organizer reserves the right to the final interpretation of the Rules and Regulations.
6. The Organizer reserves the right to:
 - a. reschedule the event;
 - b. pursue claims for damages caused by the participant;
